

# FRENCH BEADED RAINBOW FLOWER BROOCH - BEGINNER

### MATERIALS:

- 5 grams 11/0 seed beads (approx. 1/5 gram of 10 colors)
- 24 gauge silver copper-core wire
- Brooch pin
- Felt or fabric

## TOOLS:

- Wire cutters
- Chain nose pliers
- Bead spinner
- Scissors
- Ruler/Measuring tape

Resources include a step-by-step video tutorial, pre-requisites for techniques, and links for material resources.

For this project, I walk you through making a French beaded rainbow flower brooch pin. This project combines two beginner techniques, the **continuous loop** and the **continuous cross-over loop**.

The colors I used for this project are in this order for a rainbow flower: Red, Pink, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Dark Iris, Dark Purple, Violet, Brown

I used a neutral color of silver since we are beading with so many colors. I recommend using 24 gauge copper-core wire as it will keep its shape better as an accessory. Alternatively, 26 gauge wire can be used but it will be more flimsy.

Technique: - Continuous Loops (CL)/Continuous Cross-over loops (CCL) Pattern: - Stamens: Six 10-bead CL, Petals: Ten 20-bead CCL)

PREPARE: String 10 beads of Red, Pink, Orange, Yellow, Green, and Blue on a length of 45 inch (114.3 cm) length of 24 gauge copper-core wire. Knot the ends so that beads do not fall off.

**1.** Stamens: Leave a 3 inch (7.6 cm) tail. Feed the beads down to the 3 inch mark and cross the wires. *Photo 1.* Twist twice to form a loop.

2. Leave approx.  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch (.63 cm) of bare wire space. Feed the 10 pink beads down and make a loop. *Photo 2.* 

3. Follow Step 2 for the rest of the loops. *Photo 3.* 

4. Gather the loops together and scrunch them together in the center.

5. Wrap the working-wire around the tail wire once. *Photo 4.* 

6. Re-position the working-wire by wrapping it around the base a loop across from the wires. *Photo 5.* 

7. Petals: String on approx. 2.5 inches (6.3 cm) of Red beads.

8. Leave approx  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch (.63 cm) of bare wire in between and make a loop. Pinch the loop so that it is elongated. *Photo 6.* 


9. Push more beads onto the working-wire. Position the wire up in between the loop. *Photo 7.* 

10. Remove any excess beads and bend the bare wire over the loop. *Photo 8.* 

11. Push the beads up to cover the wire. Remove any excess beads then wrap the working wire around the base twice. *Photo 9.* The working-wire now is back on the right.

12. String approx. 2.5 inch (6.3 cm) of pink beads. Leave approx.  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch and make the next petal. *Photo 10.* 

13. Follow Steps 8 to 11 for the remainder of the color petals in this order: Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Dark Iris, Purple, Violet, Brown. *Photo 11.* 












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## ASSEMBLY

1. Wrap the **Petals** around the **Stamen** tightly. Twist the two wires together slightly. *Photo 12.* 

2. Re-position the working-wire to the other end of the flower by wrapping it around the base of a petal. *Photo 13.* 

3. Open a brooch pin and insert the wires into the holes. If you have a brooch with three holes, insert the wires into the outer two holes. *Photo 14.* 

4. Wrap each wire around the pin several times. *Photo 15.* 

5. Take your pliers and wrap the tail wires around the base between the flower and the brooch and tuck them in. *Photo 16.* 

6. Cut a small fabric circle to size to cover the back of the brooch pin.

7. Put some hot glue along the length of the brooch pin. *Photo 17.* 

8. Press the fabric circle onto the middle. *Photo 18.* 

9. Put glue along the flaps and press down. *Photo 19.* 

10. Shape the petals. Photo 20.
