MATERIALS:

- 5 grams Color A - 11/0 Matsuno Dynamite White Ceylon beads
- 5 grams Color B - 11/0 Venetian orange seed beads
- 17 grams Color C - Matsuno Dynamite 11/0 rainbow purple (311 11/0 RR)
- 17 grams Color D - Matsuno Dynamite translucent inside rainbow peacock (323 11/0 RR)
- 17 grams Color E - Matsuno Dynamite Dark lilac (214 11/0 RR)
- 17 grams Color F - Matsuno Dynamite col blue fuchsia (228 11/0 RR)
- 17 grams Color G - Matsuno Dynamite bl lilac (227 11/0 RR)
- 25 grams Color H - Matsuno Dynamite matte lime green (18 MA 11/0 RR)
- 52 grams Color I - Matsuno Dynamite silverlined dark green (83:SR 11/0 SR)
- 70 feet 24 gauge purple copper-core wire (petals)
- 65 feet 24 gauge green copper-core wire (leaves)
- 14 feet 28 gauge gold copper-core wire (stamen and pistils)
- 15 feet 30 gauge purple copper-core wire (lacing petals)
- 30 feet 30 gauge green copper-core wire (lacing leaves and assembly)
- 15 feet white embroidery floss
- 5 (6 inch – 15.2 cm) lengths of 18 gauge stem wire

NOTES ABOUT THIS PROJECT

BEADS

I mostly use Matsuno Dynamite beads in my designs but you can use any brand or color of beads you wish. It does not necessarily need to coordinate with mine.

WIRE SUBSTITUTIONS

For the petals, pistils and stamens, stick with the recommended wire gauges. Alternatively, you can substitute 22 gauge wire for the 24 gauge green wire if the 24 gauge wire is too fiddly to work with for the longer lengths of leaves.
